
















## **CHAPTER III NEWS**


We look forward continuing to provide great educational opportunities in 2025 to all of our WHEA members. Thank you to our EPDC committee members who work to put this together.

## WHEA Wisconsin Association Management (WAM) Report




#### MANDI DUERST, WHEA ACCOUNT MANAGER

- Accounts Receivable Transition -- The goal was for WAM to fully manage accounts receivable beginning June 1. The accounting team is still awaiting access to a few key systems to move forward with full implementation. Updates will be provided as needed.
- 2. Certificate Distribution -- All 2024 Annual Conference certificates have been sent to attendees. Additional certificates for 2024 programs that took place prior to WAM's transition remain in progress and will be processed in order of total credits earned.
- 3. 2025 Conference Planning -- Planning is actively underway for the 2025 Annual Conference. Work is progressing on the Banquet Event Order (BEO) in coordination with the venue to ensure all logistical needs are addressed. Speaker confirmations and contracts have been received for all presenters, except for the Joint Commission, which is in progress. Collaboration with the Technology Committee continues to support registration and event logistics through CVENT and updates to whea.com.
