3. Codes issued by DSPS (identified as Department of Safety and Professional Services) and DHS are part of the Wisconsin Administrative Code and apply to facilities located in Wisconsin as listed in the Application section of each Wisconsin code. “SPS” is the designation for codes issued by DSPS (formerly Department of Commerce). “DHS” is the designation for codes issued by the Department of Health Services (formerly DHFS).
4. NFPA, ASHRAE, ANSI, and other standards and model codes apply only if compliance is mandated in a code that is legally applicable to the facility in question. In general, compliance with voluntary standards and model codes, when they do not conflict with the legally applicable requirements, is recommended as good operating procedure. We have attempted to list as many Wisconsin code references to standards and model codes as possible, however, lack of a listing in this table does not guarantee that compliance with a standard is not required. The Life Safety Code (NFPA 101) incorporates many other NFPA standards by reference.
5. Wisconsin Statute 50 transfers administration and enforcement of hospitals, nursing homes, hospices, Facilities for the Developmentally Disabled, and Community Based Residential facilities from DSPS to DHS. These are described in DHS 83, 124, 132, 134, etc. See the latest revision of Code Alert 18. Plumbing plans and fees must also be submitted to the Department of Commerce. Plan submittals to DSPS should also include plumbing plans for review of fixture types and locations.
6. DHS contacts are listed in the latest revision of Code Alert 7, which is available at [www.whea.com](http://www.whea.com). The general DHS phone number is (608) 266-1865. Plan Approval Application forms can be obtained by calling (608) 264-7748 (Madison) or (414) 227-4045 (Milwaukee).
7. In general, SPS 316 requires compliance with the most recent version of the National Electrical Code (NEC, also known as NFPA 70) as soon as there has been time to evaluate the new revisions. DSPS requirements, which are for a newer version of NEC than that enforced by JCAHO or the Life Safety Code (NFPA 101), normally govern electrical installations. Refer to the latest revision of Code Alert 9 for a listing of dates when DHS and JCAHO adopted various versions of the Life Safety Code.
8. On January 1, 1987 DHS mandated compliance with HSS 132 (Now DHS 132).
9. JCAHO 1/97 adopted 1996/97 AIA “Guidelines for Construction and Equipment of Hospital and Medical Facilities”. SPS 364 also mandates conformance to AIA.
10. DSPS writes codes and enforces them for most occupancy groups. DHS enforces codes for the occupancies listed in note 5 above (basically I2 occupancies). DSPS enforces codes in other occupancies.

11. SPS Chapters 361-365 apply to all public buildings and places of employment in Wisconsin, except those specifically excluded by SPS 361.
12. Contact telephone number for DSPS is (608) 266-2112.
13. Illinois is not a part of ASHE Region 6.
14. The Joint Commission (JCAHO) and Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), as of July 5, 2016 adopted the 2012 version of the Life Safety Code (NFPA 101) to replace the previously enforced 2000 version. CMS will begin surveying for compliance with the 2012 LSC on November 1, 2016. Here is a link to an ASHE webpage containing the Federal Register document and the CMS memo clarifying November 1<sup>st</sup> date for new regulations.
