






2021 Founders Award for Outstanding Service

Matthew Malmin Chapter V President


As the leaves are falling it's a reminder that change is constant.


FGI - 2022 edition guideline public proposal period concluded in 2019, the comment period concluded in 2021, and publication is anticipated in 2022. For those interested in a set of the guidelines they will be available at: www.fgiguidelines.org/about-fgi/

CMS - Interim Life Safety/CMS 1135 - CMS 1135 waiver is predicated upon a State of Emergency - federal AND state. Facilities need to plan now, how they will convert permanently or close their Interim Provisions to meet all Physical Environment requirements (WI Commercial Building Code, Life

Safety code, and DHS 124 / DHS 132 respectively). Note the **Federal emergency has been expanded to January 2022.**
