IN MEMORIAM

James "Jim" Hill

Jim Hill passed away on Friday, August 19, 2022. He was 48 yrs old. Jim was born in Watertown, the son of Richard and Darlene (Schommer) Hill. He graduated in 1992 from Watertown High School. After high school, Jim enlisted in the United States Marine Corps where he served our country Semper Fidelis (always faithful) from 1992-1996. Following his service, Jim became employed by ProHealth Care where he worked for 26 years. He started as a member of the Facilities team and went on to serve as a supervisor and manager within the department. He played a key role during many regulatory surveys and capital improvement projects over the years.



"Jim was always willing to help others and his compassion, wisdom, expertise and friendship were valued by those who worked with him," said John McGinnis, Facilities Director. "Jim's quick wit, sense of humor and positive attitude, even while struggling with his own health, made him an endearing person to know."

Giving back to the community was important to Jim. He helped Waukesha County Technical College create a facilities technician program to train those with interest in his field and worked with the Oconomowoc Chamber of Commerce to help local businesses develop green initiatives to reduce their carbon footprint.

He made many friends at both ProHealth Oconomowoc Memorial Hospital and Waukesha Memorial Hospital, working in maintenance where he became a leader and managed many people. Jim valued his work and all the contacts that he made during his time there. He was a 15 yr member of WHEA.

Jim was the father of two children, Lexi and Dillon who he loved deeply. He loved life and loved to be silly. Jim also had a love for the Lord Jesus Christ and belonged to Hope Lake Country in Oconomowoc where he volunteered as often as he could. At the end of 2019, Jim was diagnosed with stage 4 Neuroendocrine Carcinoma. He battled the disease and never complained throughout the whole process. He was faithful to God and knew that he would live eternally with the Lord. He lived life having fun with his family and friends.

A Memorial Service was held at 3:00 PM on Saturday, August 27, 2022, at Hope Lake Country Church in Oconomowoc with Pastor Sean O'Connell presiding. Military Honors were held at the church immediately following the service.

The world of Codes ad Standards is pretty stable of late, which is good news for all of us. Here are the things we are tracking and requests for some help from you:

WI Plumbing Code: DSPS currently revising Plumbing code. There are only two non-healthcare items on the agenda. In the future there will be a red line copy of the code. Stay tuned for future Public Comment and Hearing...we encourage anyone interested to participate in the review period. With the Fall election, we don't expect much action on this in the near term.

ICC Updates: IBC/ICC/IMC (International Building Code, International Code Council, International Mechanical Code) will be updated to 2021 Edition. FYI...2015 IBC was effective starting May 1, 2018, throughout Wisconsin. The hope of the 2021 is to increase alignment with the LSC 101 2021 edition (not this is not adopted code yet) e.g., the increase in smoke zone size from 22,500 to 40,000 sq. ft.

If you have knowledge and Interest in the ICC? Please consider joining the Code Committee as we could use some help in this area.

DHS Preliminary Project Meetings (PPM): Department continues to promote Preliminary (continued on page 6)



- Project Meetings (PPM). The design team facilitates the meeting logistics and stakeholder invitations. Emphasis is to review the project scope, schedule, and unique design features. During the Preliminary Project Meeting is an excellent time to discuss the level and extent of inspections. Inspections are not required by state statute nor administrative code, hence the Departments ability to continue to provide inspections yet on a lower frequency. Prioritization remains on federal survey and state level plan reviews. Once the Department is fully staffed, the number of inspections should return to their prior levels.
- FGI 2021 editions: Published in April 2022. We think the soonest TJC would adopt might be 1/1/23. No other info on adoption e.g., CMS or other AOs
- CMS 1135 Waiver: Predicated upon a State of Emergency - federal AND state. Facilities need to plan now if, how they will convert permanently or close their Interim Provisions to meet Physical (continued on page 7)

- Environment (WI Commercial Building Code, Life Safety code, and DHS 124 / DHS 132, etc.). Federal
 emergency expanded primarily for hospitals has been extended to January 2023. CMS 1135 Waivers
 expired for LTC, inpatient hospice, ESRD, and ICF/IID facilities on 6/08/2022.
- NFPA 101 and 99 2023 Editions. 2023 Technical Meeting Las Vegas Jun 18-21, 2023 and we need WHEA representation at the meeting. If interested contact Jeff Eckstein jeckstein@findorff.com or Dave Soens david.soens@dhs.wisconsin.gov. These editions or portions of these updated Codes could be adopted someday, so our involvement in the development of these codes is critical.


Everyone in WHEA, from our current members to our longest serving

Ed Cosner was awarded this years' Founders Award for Outstanding Service this past September at the 2022 WHEA Annual Banquet & Awards Program.






