Congratulation to Gordon Howie! Gordy has been nominated as WHEA's candidate for the 2012 ASHE Region 6 Emerging Leader Award.

It has become increasingly difficult to find members to take on a role in Chapter Leadership or a State Board position. Although participating at either of these levels is very rewarding, these roles take a significant personal commitment of time and energy. In most cases we all have many activities going on in our lives and it is hard to do everything we want to do, and unless there is something to be gained - it is not easy to commit. This is not a

To continue our commitment to our members - on the agenda for the June WHEA Board meeting is a topic to discuss options to reduce the fees our members pay for the conference and educational events. If you have ever wondered - what is the difference between the WHEA-ASHE Liaison and the ASHE Advocacy Liaison - you're not alone. I've been asking that question for more than two years. Good news is that we now have an answer. Last December the ASHE Advocacy Committee rolled out the Repaving the Advocacy Highway and clarified the role of ASHE Advocacy Liaison. I will try

shared with the affiliated chapter members, ASHE sends the information to the Chapter Liaison who distributes it to the members. Also, if a member has a question for ASHE it can be directed to the Liaison to communicate with ASHE leadership or the correct member of the ASHE staff.

The ASHE Advocacy Liaison is part of the redesigned ASHE advocacy strategy known as *Repaving the Advocacy Highway*. The Advocacy Highway is designed to improve communications efforts between the ASHE Advocacy Committee and the members of the affiliated chapter code committees. There are some great new tools for reporting local, state and nation code concerns. The

ASHE website boosts a new page for the members to anonymously report crazy or inconsistent code interpretations to Advocacy Committee for clarification. The goal is to keep all parties informed of the miss-interpretations and to take action so they do not grow or expand to other areas of the country. In WHEA this role will be called the ASHE Advocacy Liaison to the WHEA Code Committee.


Chapter II has met two times since the last board meeting: The February meeting was

A meeting of Chapter III was held on January 19, 2012. The meeting was held at Holy Family Memorial Hospital, Manitowoc, Wisconsin.


CHFM and MECH Scholarships – A motion was made, seconded and passed to offer (1) scholarship for CHFM and (2) MECH Certifications schol-


arships to be selected at the May meeting and allow for (1) year to complete. The requirements and process will remain the same as in past years.

### **Bylaws Committee Report**



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#### **Codes and Standards Committee Update**

In 2012, the committee has met once on 3/8/12. We also held special meetings on 1/18/12 and 1/27/12 to review change proposals to the FGI. The FGI Institute accepted approximately 90% of WHEA recommended changes! Thanks to Wade Rudolph and Donella Sarauer for their help facilitating the process. Wade Rudolph was appointed to the FGI steering committee in December of 2011, and also serves as the chair for the Facilities Management Focus Group. There were over 2,000 proposed changes to the guidelines last year that were reviewed.

The final meeting to review the final proposals will be April 2013 with the new standard published by January 2014. Wade and Jon Cechvala will provide an update at the Spring Code Update conference.

#### **Breaking News...**

#### Code Work Groups (CWG) have restarted

Thanks to the efforts of Bill Lauzon, the Code Works Groups will be restarted in April! This is chiefly due to:

- Support by the DQA Relationship Enhancement Committee, and
- Support of the WHEA Code Committee, and
- Recent success of DQA approving 6 of past CWG recommendations, and
- Support of the concept by DQA's David Soens (although staffing level limits DQA involvement at this time)

The kick off meeting was held on April 5, 2012. The discussion was around:

 Re-affirm the CWG Purpose Statement: "The Code Work Groups assist DQA to arrive at an understanding of consistent code applications, and act as a sounding board for DQA process changes, in essence to "clarify the ruler" that designers & facilities must measure against. The Work Groups consider code related questions that arise during the design, construction, and survey processes; research the intent of the code; evaluate situations that effect the interpretation; and recommend interpretations to DQA regulators. The DQA regulators will review the recommendations and will modify as needed to receive DQA approval and post them on the DQA Construction Website. Position Statements must be consistent with CMS guidelines and Commerce interpretations."

- Review the DQA approved interpretations
- Review the interpretations waiting to be approved
- New topics that have come up that need a recommendation and an official interpretation.
- Organizational structure
- Use of a Blog to facilitate recommendation input

## CMS References some 2012 Life Safety Code 101:

CMS has issued a new memo that it will accept waivers to allow the use of certain 2012 Life Safety Code Standards. The Code Committee will monitor the process. Discussions between CMS State Agencies and accrediting agencies like the Joint Commission are under way.

## ASHRAE VENTILATION & MECHANICAL 170 UPDATE:

The ASHRAE 170 was amended in January as this document is under continuous maintenance. These changes will be incorporated in the new 2014 FGI document.

Goals for the year were to Improve Participation and Increased emphasis on Education.



This award is presented to a candidate who has been nominated by one or more of his/her peers, evaluated by the elected state board members by comparing all nominations received against a criteria-based scoring grid, and subsequently determining a recipient by a simple majority vote.

WHEA members who wish to nominate someone for this award should submit nomination papers prior to June 30<sup>th</sup>, 2012 so the board can evaluate all the nominations at the August board meeting and be able to present the award at the 2012 Annual Banquet.

A more detailed description of the award concept, its purpose, the qualifications of candidates and an outline of the nomination and selection process is included as a separate document within this newsletter. Please consider placing the name of one of your peers in nomination for the Pioneer Award. There is no shortage of very worthy candidates within our ranks. # Robert H. Botts HEALTHCARE ENGINEERING PIONEER AWARD

The intent of this award is to annually recognize a member of WHEA who has made significant contributions through personal or professional initiatives to improve and promote health care facilities management or the health care industry, in keeping with the mission statement of the organization: "The Wisconsin healthcare Engineering Association serves the community by providing a safe and comfortable environment for heath care through the application and practice of health care engineering developed through education, professional growth, and advocacy in codes and standards."

#### The AWARD:

Will be presented annually and consists of an engraved plaque displaying the WHEA logo, the recipients name and chapter, and the year awarded. Additionally, a letter recognizing the award with a brief synopsis of details of the recipient's accomplishments will be presented to both the recipient and his/her CEO/President.

#### Qualifications:

In order to be nominated for the WHEA Healthcare Engineering Pioneer award, the candidate must meet the following criteria:

- Must be a current member of the WHEA
- Must have held continuous membership for a minimum of three (3) years
- Must not be a current elected state board member or an elected board member during the previous calendar year.

#### **Achievements & Contributions:**

In order to be selected for the WHEA Healthcare Engineering Pioneer award, the successful candidate must have attained a significant level of achievement (as a professional working in the field of health care facilities management, or allied health care professions,) in one or more of the following areas:

- through achievement of significant operational efficiencies.
- through implementation or design of cost containment strategies,
- through significant innovation in facility design,
- through innovative facilities management practices,
- through innovative safety initiatives,
- through innovative technology initiatives,
- through innovations in construction management strategies,
- through participation in citizen advisor boards or other advocacy projects where personal facilities management expertise or applied engineering excellence:
  - significantly improved the overall quality of health care in the community(s) being served,
  - significantly improved accessibility to health care services,
  - significantly improved local, state, or national code compliance or code revisions, or
  - significantly improved levels of health care services to the community(s) served.

#### Selection Procedure:

- 1. Candidates must be nominated by another member of the WHEA, in writing, including:
  - A written narrative of not less than 250 words, describing the actions that you feel qualifies your nominee for the Healthcare Engineering Pioneer award.
  - Include one (1) additional letter of support if so desired (not required)
  - Attach other supporting documentation as needed to validate the accomplishments of the nominee
- Nomination papers must be submitted to the current state WHEA President for the previous calendar year, prior to June 30<sup>th</sup> of the current year.
- The WHEA elected state board members will evaluate all submitted nomination papers, with the aid of a criteria-based scoring grid.
- The selected recipient will be determined by a simple majority vote of the elected state board members.
- The award will be presented to the selected recipient by the President of WHEA at the Annual Banquet or other appropriate event or venue prior to the end of the calendar year.
