

Chapter Meeting Conference Call In System


- The state needs to give the chapters the tools to allow the chapters to meet easily.

Final Webinars of the 2016 Subscription Series

October 13 "Room Pressurization" presented by Kris Dubiel, DES – Mechanical Designer

Maintaining the proper pressure relationships in healthcare is important for several reasons including: odor control, infection control, fume control, maintaining "clean" areas and preventing "dirty" areas from spreading into neutral areas, and thereby protecting patients and staff. As a whole, it is preferred that a building is slightly positive in order to minimize the infiltration of cold, pollens, and mold, however this is difficult to control with multiple air handling systems or with multiple floor levels.

Specific areas that are required by regulatory agencies to maintain positive pressure include: Operating Rooms, Cath Labs, Critical and Intensive Care, Newborn intensive Care, Trauma, Laser Eye Rooms, Protective Environment Rooms, Medication Rooms, Pharmacies, Endoscopy Rooms, Central Supply Clean Work Rooms, Central Supply Sterile Storage, and Clean Workrooms.

At the other end of the spectrum are the areas that are required to maintain negative pressurization in relation to the adjoining spaces. These areas include: Toilet Rooms, Gas storage, ER waiting, Triage, ER decontamination, Radiology waiting areas, Airborne Infection Isolation (AII) Rooms, Central supply decontamination, Sterilizer Equipment Rooms, Laboratories, Endoscope cleaning areas, Hydrotherapy, Physical Therapy, Dishwashing, Laundry, Soiled linen, Janitor's closets, Soiled workrooms, Hazardous material storage, Bathing rooms, and Beauty shops.

The pressure differentials required for some of these spaces are very small and therefore the monitoring devices used need to be properly calibrated. Some of the AHJ's will reference FGI / ASHRAE 170, USP 797, or AAMI ST79 for compliance.

Nov 10 "Preparing for Fire Door Inspections" presented by G.R. Zeckman of Allegion

With the adoption of the 2012 Life Safety Code, annual Fire Door inspections are now required. specific inspection points are located in chapter 5 of NFPA 80 2010 edition. These requirements are for both new and existing facilities. The person performing the inspections must have knowledge of the operating components of the type of door. Before opening the door for a functional test, it must be visually inspected to ensure that there is nothing about the door that will endanger anyone if you open the door. Any obstructions to the operation of the door are not allowed. At a minimum, the items that must be inspected include: 1) No open holes or breaks in the door or frame surface 2)the glazing is intact, securely fastened, and properly labeled 3)hardware is secured, aligned, and in working order 4) No missing or broken parts 5) Clearances are limited to 1/8" (measured from the pull side of beveled doors) on vertical and horizontal edges and 3/4" undercut 6) Self-closing devices completely close from full open position 7) Coordinators ensure the inactive leaf closes before the active leaf 8) Latching hardware operates and secures 9) Nothing that interferes with the operation 10) Field modifications of fire doors are not allowed, however, you can request permission. If you are granted permission, be certain to maintain documentation. 11) If required, gasketing and edge seals must be present and intact.


Adoption of the 2012 LSC -Waiver Provisions for Plan Review




The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) adopted the 2012 edition of the Life Safety Code (LSC) and began surveying for compliance on November 1, 2016.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) Wis. Admin. Code Chapters DHS 124, DHS131, DHS 132 and DHS 134 currently adopt the 2000 edition of the LSC. Revision of these chapters has begun, yet is not anticipate to be completed until well into the year 2017.





